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BRICS Seek to Cement Position in Global Economic Landscape



Leaders from Brazil, Russia, India, China, and South Africa- collectively known as the BRICS - formally announced their plans to launch a new development bank on 17 March, in what analysts say is a move to reduce the group's dependence on the Bretton Woods institutions. The two-day meet, held in Durban, South Africa, also raised issues such as the impact of developed country monetary policy on trade, and the importance of the next WTO chief being from a developing country.

The 26-27 March gathering - the fifth in as many years - led to the eThekweni Declaration, named after the municipality that includes Durban and its surrounding towns. The event marked the first time that the summit was held in Africa.

The final document outlines the importance of cementing the BRICS alliance further: aside from sharing an acronym, the five emerging economies have often found it difficult to reach common ground on various topics, and have varying political and economic characteristics. For instance, the inclusion of South Africa into the group just two years ago had been greeted with scepticism by some observers, as some noted that its size as an economy does not match up with its counterparts in the group.

The BRICS together account for approximately a quarter of global GDP and 40 percent of the world's population.

BRICS agree to establish development bank, disagree on details

The highlight of the two-day proceedings was the long-awaited announcement of whether the BRICS would be establishing their own development bank, after the group's finance ministers were tasked last year with evaluating the idea's feasibility.

The goal, leaders said at the time, would be for the bank to "[mobilise] resources for infrastructure and sustainable development projects in BRICS and other emerging economies and developing countries."

The planned development bank "is feasible and viable," leaders confirmed in a statement on Wednesday. Such a bank would "supplement the existing efforts of multilateral and regional financial institutions for global growth and development."

However, officials speaking earlier during the summit admitted that various key details remain to be worked out before the proposed bank can become fully operational - a process that is expected to take years. For instance, disagreements have already surfaced among the BRICS on the specifics of the bank's mandate, and how exactly the institution would be financed.

While members ahead of the gathering had said that the five countries would together contribute a total of US\$50 billion of capital into the proposed institution, that number has reportedly been scaled back, and how much each individual member would give was also left unclear. Where the bank

will be located was similarly left undecided during this week's meeting.

The proposed development bank is widely being seen as an effort by the BRICS to limit their reliance on the World Bank and International Monetary Fund (IMF). The five-country group has long argued that the two international finance institutions need a substantial overhaul with regards to their governance structure - a stance that BRICS leaders reiterated in Wednesday's communiqué.

Some analysts suggest that establishing their own bank could also allow the BRICS to place added pressure on existing international organisations - such as the IMF and World Bank - to give them more weight in decision-making processes.

The plans for a BRICS development bank have so far been welcomed by the World Bank. "Establishing a development bank is a significant undertaking," the Washington-based institution said in a statement. "The World Bank will stand steady and work closely to partner with regional development banks in a bid to enhance the effectiveness of our collective work."

Trade

With regards to trade, the final statement focused largely on the ongoing preparations for the WTO's upcoming ministerial conference, which is scheduled for 3-6 December in the Indonesian island of Bali. The global trade body's 159 members are currently trying to negotiate a small package of deliverables from the broader Doha Round of trade talks in time for the high-level event, after the overall discussions were formally declared at an impasse in late 2011.

"We are committed to [ensuring] that new proposals and approaches to the Doha Round negotiations will reinforce the core principles and the developmental mandate of the Doha Round," BRICS leaders said. "We look forward to significant and meaningful deliverables that are balanced and address key development concerns of the poorest and most vulnerable WTO members."

The ongoing race to replace WTO Director-General Pascal Lamy, who steps down from his post at the global trade body in August, was also referred to in the final communiqué. BRICS leaders stressed that his successor will need to show a "commitment to multilateralism and to enhancing the effectiveness of the WTO, including through a commitment to support efforts that will lead to an expeditious conclusion of the [Doha Round]."

In addition, the new global trade chief should be from a developing country, the five leaders said, though they stopped short of jointly backing a particular nominee. Of the nine candidates currently lobbying for the WTO role, eight of them are from members that are self-designated as developing countries, and one of them - Brazilian WTO Ambassador Roberto Carvalho de Azevêdo - is from a BRICS country.

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A separate statement by BRICS trade ministers released on Tuesday gave additional details on the group's concerns for the multilateral trading system. For one, it reiterated the group's worry over "initiatives that might undermine the coherence of the Doha Development Agenda and that deviate from the principles of multilateralism," in an apparent reference to some efforts - such as the discussions among 21 WTO members over a possible plurilateral deal on services- that are being pursued among subsets of the global trade body's membership.

In addition, the WTO's "single undertaking" principle, and the development mandate of the negotiations, must be respected, trade ministers said, as the global trade body continues its efforts to move the Doha talks forward.

Rich country monetary policy draws fire

Developed country monetary policy also came under scrutiny during the Durban gathering. Central banks in the US, EU, and Japan have faced criticism from some trading partners in recent months over their decisions to undertake additional rounds of monetary easing, which have sparked fears of a "global currency war."

Many have argued that the moves by these

central banks can create exchange rate misalignments that can effectively make developed countries' exports more competitive than those of their trading partners. Advanced economies, meanwhile, have noted that these efforts are aimed not toward bettering their terms of trade, but at advancing domestic policy objectives such as reducing unemployment or fighting deflation.

Foreign reserves, currency swaps

In another move ostensibly aimed at reducing dependency on the IMF in a crisis, the five-member group agreed to establish a "BRICS contingent reserve arrangement" - essentially an exchange pool of foreign reserves aimed at ensuring financial stability and dealing with short-term liquidity problems that might arise. The idea was first tabled in April 2011.

Earlier this week, Brazil and China inked a deal that would allow them to conduct up to US\$30 billion of trade in their local currencies, rather than having to use the dollar or the euro as they have done in the past. The deal would be valid for the next three years.

Concerning Implementation of "Electronics and IT Goods (Requirement of Compulsory Registration) Order, 2012"

Subject: Extension in date of coming into effect of the "Electronics and IT Goods (Requirement of Compulsory Registration) Order, 2012".

WHEREAS Govt. of India, DeitY has issued the "Electronics and IT Goods (Requirement of Compulsory Registration) Order, 2012" (herein-after called the "Order") for 15 electronic items, AND WHEREAS certain issues have arisen with regard to compliance to the Order, AND WHEREAS these issues have been discussed with all stakeholders AND WHEREAS to address these issues, and to sustain the resources to facilitate the industry for smooth implementation of the Order, the following notification is issued in continuation of the Order.

1. Extension in date

The date of coming into force of the "Electronics and IT Goods (Requirement of Compulsory Registration) Order, 2012" stands extended to 3rd July 2013.

2. Grandfathering of Products

All products manufactured/imported before the notified date of coming into effect of the Order i.e. 3rd July, 2013 shall not be covered by the provisions of the Order.

3. An additional period of three months for the manufacturing units to comply fully with "Electronics and IT Goods (Requirement of Compulsory Registration) Order 2012" shall be avail-

able w.e.f. 4th July subject to the following:

Manufacturing Units:

a. Which submit the request for registration to Bureau of Indian Standards (BIS) with complete test reports from BIS recognized labs before July 3, 2013 are allowed such an extension of time till October 3, 2013 for full compliance with the Order.

b. Which submit the products to the BIS recognized labs before July 3, 2013, but test reports are not available, be levied a fee on a per month basis at the rates specified in Annexure a to this notification, for such period till they submit request for registration to BIS with complete test reports.

c. Which do not submit the products to the BIS recognized labs before July 3, 2013, be levied a fee on a per month basis at 3 times the rates specified in Annexure A to this notification, for such period till they submit their samples for testing and thereafter with a fee on a per month basis at the rates specified in Annexure A to this notification for such period till they submit request for registration to BIS with complete test reports.

5. Provided that the applicants for such extension are duly supported by evidences for the stage of compliance and provisions in clause (3) above.

6. Provided further that the fee as stated in Clause (3) above is duly submitted in advance by Demand Draft/Pay Order in favour of "Pay and Accounts Office, DeitY".

7. Provided that the fee so calculated by the notified authority shall remain uncontested and non-refundable.

8. Provided that such fee shall be calculated in units of per month basis and request could be made in advance and for this purpose part of a month shall be treated as a full month.

9. Besides manufacturing units, request for such extension could be made by liaison office or branch office located in India of the manufacturing units located abroad and extension orders shall be issued in the name of manufacturing units but handed over to the liaison office or branch office located in India.

Provisional Anti-dumping Duty Imposed on Meta Phenylene Diamine from China

Ntnfn 02-ADD 22.03.2013 (DoR) Whereas in the matter of Meta Phenylene Diamine (hereinafter referred to as the subject goods), falling under Chapter 29 of the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff Act, 1975 (51 of 1975), originating in, or exported from the People's Republic of China (hereinafter referred to as the subject country), and imported into India, the designated authority in its preliminary findings published in the Gazette of India, Extraordinary, Part I, Section 1, *vide* notification No. 14/4/2012-DGAD, dated the 1st January, 2013, had come to the conclusion that –

(a) the subject goods have been exported to India from the subject country below its normal value;

(b) the domestic industry has suffered material injury in respect of the subject goods;

(c) the material injury has been caused by the dumped imports of the subject goods from subject country;

AND WHEREAS, the designated authority in its aforesaid findings, has recommended imposition of provisional anti-dumping duty on imports of the subject goods, originating in or exported from the subject country and imported into India, in order to remove injury to the domestic industry;

NOW, THEREFORE, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-sections (1) and (5) of section 9A of the Customs Tariff Act, 1975 (51 of 1975), read with rules 13 and 20 of the Customs

Tariff (Identification, Assessment and Collection of Anti-dumping Duty on Dumped Articles and for Determination of Injury) Rules, 1995, the Central Government, after considering the aforesaid preliminary findings of the designated authority, hereby imposes on the subject goods, the description of which is specified in column (3) of the Table below, falling under tariff item of the First Schedule to the said Customs Tariff Act as specified in the corresponding entry in column (2), originating in the country as specified in the corresponding entry in column (4), and produced by the producer as specified in the corresponding entry in column (5), when exported from the country as specified in the corresponding entry in column (6), by the exporter as specified in the corresponding entry in column (7), and imported into India, an anti-dumping duty at the rate equal to the amount as indicated in the corresponding entry in column (8), in the currency as specified in the corresponding entry in column (10) and as per unit of measurement as specified in the corresponding entry in column (9) of the said Table.

2. The anti-dumping duty imposed under this notification shall be levied for a period not exceeding six months (unless revoked, amended or superseded earlier) from the date of publication of this notification in the Gazette of India and shall be paid in Indian currency.

Ntnfn 03-ADD 26.03.2013 (DoR) Whereas, the designated authority *vide* notification No. 15/22/2011-DGAD, dated the 24th February, 2012, published in the Gazette of India, Extraordinary, Part I, Section 1, dated the 24th February, 2012, had initiated review in terms of sub-section (5) of section 9A of the Customs Tariff Act, 1975 (51 of 1975) (hereinafter referred to as the Customs Tariff Act), read with rule 23 of the Customs Tariff (Identification, Assessment and Collection of Anti-dumping Duty on Dumped Articles and for Determination of Injury) Rules, 1995, in the matter of continuation of anti-dumping duty

Prohibition on Export of Pulses (Except Kabuli Chana) Extended by One More Year to 31 March 2014

Subject: Extension of prohibition on export of Pulses (except Kabuli Chana and 10,000 tonnes of organic pulses) upto 31.03.2014.

38-Ntfn(RE) In exercise of the powers 25.03.2013 conferred by Section 5 of the (DGFT) Foreign Trade (Development & Regulation) Act, 1992 (No.22 of 1992) read with Para 2.1 of the Foreign Trade Policy, 2009-2014 (as amended from time to time), the Central Government hereby amends, with immediate effect, Para 3 of Notification No.15 (RE-2006)/2004-2009 dated 27.6.2006, as amended from time to time.



2. Export of pulses was initially prohibited for a period of six months vide Notification No.15 (RE-2006)/2004-2009 dated 27.6.2006 which was extended from time to time. This extension is upto 31.03.2013 in terms of Notification No. 109(RE-2010)/2009-2014 dated 27.03.2012. Now, the prohibition on export of pulses is being extended upto 31.03.2014. This prohibition will not apply to Kabuli Chana.

3. In addition, the prohibition on export of

pulses upto 31.03.2014 will not apply to export of 10,000 MTs of organic pulses and lentils per annum as permitted through Notification No. 51(RE-2010)/2009-2014 dated 03.06.2011. Accordingly, the amended Para 3 (i) of Notification No. 109(RE-2010)/2009-2014 dated 27.03.2012 will read as under:

"3 (i) The period of validity of prohibition on exports of Pulses is extended upto 31.3.2014. This prohibition will not apply to export of (1) Kabuli Chana and (2) 10,000 MTs of organic pulses and lentils per annum. Export of organic pulses and lentils shall be subject to following conditions:

- Quantity limit shall be 10,000 MTs per annum;
- It should be duly certified by APEDA as being organic pulses and lentils;
- Export contracts should be registered with APEDA, New Delhi prior to shipment;

falling under sub-heading/tariff item of the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff Act specified in the corresponding entry in column (2), originating in the countries specified in the corresponding entry in column (4), exported from the countries specified in the corresponding entry in column (5), produced by the producers specified in the corresponding entry in column (6), exported by the exporters specified in the corresponding entry in column (7), and imported into India, an anti-dumping duty equal to the amount specified in the corresponding entry in column (8), in the currency specified in the corresponding entry in column (9) and per unit of measurement specified in the corresponding entry in column (10) of the aforesaid Table, namely:-

4. Effect of this notification

Prohibition on export of pulses has been extended by one more year; from 31.03.2013 to 31.03.2014. But, there are two exceptions to this. One is export of Kabuli Chana. Second is export of Organic Pulses and lentils; but with a ceiling of 10,000 MTs per annum and subject to certain conditions mentioned above.

10,000 MTs of Organic Edible Oils Export Permitted

Subject: Amendment in Notification No 32(RE-2012)/2009-14 dated 5th February, 2013 relating to export of edible oils.

39-Ntnf(RE) In exercise of the powers conferred by Section 5 of 25.03.2013 the Foreign Trade (Development & Regulation) Act, (DGFT) 1992 (No.22 of 1992) read with Para 2.1 of the Foreign Trade Policy, 2009-2014 (as amended from time to time), the Central Government hereby amends, with immediate effect, Notification No 32(RE-2012)/2009-14 dated 5th February 2013 relating to Sl. No. 92 of Schedule 2 of ITC(HS) Classification of Export & Import Items.



2. Export of edible oils was initially prohibited for a period of one year with effect from 17.03.2008 vide Notification No. 85 dated 17.03.2008 which was extended from time to time. Vide Notification No. 24(RE-2012)/2009-14 dated 19th October 2012, prohibition on export of edible oil has been extended till further orders.

3. Following exemptions are permitted from the prohibition on export of edible oils:

- Castor oil
- Coconut oil from all EDI Ports and through Land Custom Stations(LCS) [LCS to be notified separately]
- Deemed export of edible oils(as input raw material) from DTA to 100% EOUs for production of non-edible goods to be exported
- Edible oils from Domestic Tariff Area (DTA) to Special Economic Zones (SEZs) to be consumed by SEZ units for manufacture of processed food products, subject to applicable value addition norms
- Edible oils produced out of minor forest produce, ITC(HS) Code 15159010, 15159020, 15159030, 15159040, 15179010 and 15219020.
- 10,000 MTs of Organic edible oils per annum. The conditions notified in Notification No. 50 dated 03.06.2011 for export of organic edible oils will continue to apply.

4. Export of edible oils in branded consumer packs of upto 5 Kgs is permitted with a Minimum Export Price of USD 1500 per MT.

5. The prohibition will not apply to export of Peanut Butter, ITC (HS) Code 15179020. [This already stands notified at Sl. No. 10 of the Table in Para 1 of Notification No. 31(RE-2012)/2009-14 dated 4th February, 2013]

6. Effect of this notification

Exemptions to prohibition on export of edible oils notified on 05.02.2013 (Notification No. 32) have been expanded.
